Dear Parents and Students,

Thank you for coming alongside us at Veritas for this new school year. We are so happy to have your family as a part of our Veritas family. Please prayerfully and thoroughly read this handbook. Our prayer is that the Lord Jesus will live in and through you every day in this awesome opportunity, and that He will enable you to complete the daily tasks of preparing your child as teacher and trainer, and you, as a lifelong learner for His purposes.

Philosophy

Veritas Classical Schools understands that parents are ultimately responsible before God for the education of their children. This education includes an upbringing that will teach them the basics of education and plant in them a thirst for knowledge and truth. It is the parents' responsibility for the spiritual and academic nurturing of their children.

We believe that each child should have the opportunity to learn truth from a Christian perspective and evaluate life's challenges and philosophies through a biblical worldview.

Veritas Classical Schools have been established to provide home schooled students with:

- **Integrated core curriculum** in history, literature, composition, grammar, critical thinking, and vocabulary/language with regular assignments to outline the student's weekly work at home
- **Accountability** for completed assignments
- Teaching of **advanced subjects** with **enrichment activities** not frequently included in home school studies
- **Evaluation** of student's progress by experienced educators
- Weekly **classroom peer interaction** in an academic environment.

Goal

The ideal of Veritas Classical Schools is to offer home schooling families a unique complement to their home study programs with an emphasis on a classical Christian model of education. Veritas Classical Schools functions in the role of tutor,

assisting parents by grace in their educational roles. Each student attends the Veritas Classical Schools campus of their choice one day per week during the school year, according to his or her age group.

Purpose

The purpose of Veritas Classical Schools is to help mold students into thinkers, young men and women who do not simply *regurgitate* the information they have learned, but rather are equipped to analyze, critique, and affect the world by applying Biblical wisdom to their lives, families, and communities. Veritas Schools offer homeschooling families a unique complement to their home study programs by providing one day per week of classroom instruction, with an emphasis on classical as well as traditional subjects taught by qualified teachers from a distinctly Christian perspective.

It is our goal that Veritas students learn to think biblically and logically, not just to blindly memorize seemingly unrelated and irrelevant facts so they can do well on tests. The Veritas student is taught to be a lifelong learner, to consistently evaluate and critique relevant issues, and to always seek to skillfully communicate his thoughts winsomely. All students at Veritas Schools learn factual and philosophical truth, learn to evaluate the messages they are receiving from the world around them, and learn to defend the Christian Faith in a persuasive manner.

Veritas Code of Conduct

Veritas students are expected to honor God, their parents, their country, their instructor(s), and their fellow students, according to grace and biblical principles of conduct.

Veritas students are expected to act respectfully, honorably, honestly, and with integrity toward all church/school staff, students, facilities and property.

Students will follow the Veritas dress code.

Food may be eaten only in designated areas during breaks and during lunch period. Plastic bottles with water (only) may be kept on the student's table for sipping during class time.

Veritas Dress Code

Accreditation & Transcripts

Veritas Classical Schools received accreditation status in 2005 through the Georgia Accrediting Commission (GAC). This accreditation will allow students who meet the academic requirements to qualify for the HOPE scholarship program of Georgia. The accreditation will also be recognized by all colleges and universities. To learn more about GAC, please visit their website. Please note: The Veritas Classical Schools Newnan Campus is currently in the final stages of gaining our accreditation through the Georgia Accrediting Commission as well.

Grade Reports

Veritas Classical Schools provides regular grade reports for students during the school year. Typically, these come in printed form at the end of mid-semester (January) and at the end of the school year (June). Also, teachers return most tests/quizzes/reports to students with grades for parents review. This allows parents to keep track of grades during the semester. Students grades will appear on Engrade.

Graduation Requirements

Please note that students intending to graduate from Veritas Classical Schools must meet the graduation requirements set forth by the Georgia Accrediting Commission. It is the responsibility of the parents to ensure that the student has met all of these course requirements. At the end of the school year, Veritas Classical Schools will host a graduation ceremony to honor our seniors. This ceremony is typically held during the last week of the school year.

Transcripts

Veritas Classical Schools is able to offer students official school transcripts. These assist students tremendously in transferring into a traditional school setting and/or applying to colleges. In order for a student to receive an official transcript, he/she must have been enrolled in Veritas Classical Schools for at least one full school year.

In order to get credit for a subject that is not taught at Veritas Classical Schools, the following portfolio must be developed:

1. The parent or tutor must submit the following credentials:

- College Degree
- Major Area of study in college
- Parent is presently certified or has been certified as a teacher

2. The parent or tutor must submit the following information regarding the subject being taught:

- The name of the textbook
- The publisher of the textbook
- The specific material studied

3. At least two tests must be monitored by a faculty member from Veritas.

4. Veritas students, either through class time or homework, must accumulate 120 hours per year (for a yearly course) or 60 hours per semester (for a semester course).

Humanities Curricula - History and Language Arts

Veritas Classical Grammar School -- Grades 1 – 4

The Veritas Grammar School will emphasize student exposure to and comprehension of core knowledge in literature, writing, grammar, vocabulary, history and geography, and fine arts.

The Veritas Grammar School curriculum incorporates methods developed by Charlotte Mason, including narration, memorization, picture study, and sketching. Weekly assignments will guide the student and parents in preparation for the next week's class.

- Students will be guided by an experienced educator through a comprehensive curriculum. Parents and students will be able to refer to the textbooks throughout the week to complete assignments and move broader and deeper into the material presented in class.
- The academic program has been created to challenge students to think critically and grow in their knowledge of humanities through reading, projects, the study of Latin root-words and the integration of biblical truth in all subjects.
- Elementary students attend class with peers in the same grade level under the supervision of an experienced educator.
- Humanities classes meet one day per week from 9 am – 2 pm at the respective campus.
- Students have the opportunity to take an additional math and/or science class.

Veritas Classical Preparatory School -- Grades 5 – 12

In the Veritas Preparatory School all subjects are taught from the Christian biblical worldview.

- The curriculum integrates history (world and American), literature (classical, American, British), composition, grammar, study skills, logic, and critical thinking.
- Vocabulary development through Latin and Greek roots culminates in a formalized study of Latin and Greek as languages in high school.
- Each week, the student will receive an assignment sheet delineating the work required in each subject area.
- Students will participate in a combined grade level classroom that allows them to interact with peers and promotes classroom discussion and group projects.
- Humanities & Language Arts classes meet one day per week from 9 am – 2 pm at the respective campus.
- Students have the opportunity to take an additional math and/or science class which meets 1-1/2 hours before and/or after humanities.

The Classical Model of Education

Veritas Classical Schools utilizes a time-proven method of instruction that is referred to as the Classical model. The process is divided into the **Trivium** and the **Quadrivium**.

Trivium

The Trivium serves as the foundation for all education -- providing students with the tools which enable them to think, to understand, and to grasp the relationships between the Creator and His creation, as well as between themselves and the subjects they will study.

The three aspects of the Trivium correspond with the three stages of a child's general development, and they are referred to as **Grammar**, **Dialectic**, and **Rhetoric**.

Grammar

**The first stage:
Early elementary school
years**

Mastery of the first stage is typically accomplished by younger children because of their natural love of learning and relative ease by which they memorize new information.

Veritas Classical Grammar school will emphasize student exposure to and comprehension of core knowledge in literature, language, history, geography, cultural literacy, critical thinking, and the fine arts.

In addition, the curriculum will incorporate methods developed by Charlotte Mason, including narration, picture study, and nature sketching.

Quadrivium

The Quadrivium consists of the study of specific subjects. Since the Quadrivium is analogous to university training, Veritas Schools restrict their teaching to the Trivium.

Dialectic

**The second stage:
Upper elementary / middle
school years**

In this stage of childhood development many children begin to challenge authority and question what they have been taught. The Dialectic takes advantage of this natural inclination by teaching the student the laws of logic and the rules of proper argumentation as applied to the study of all subjects.

Students learn how the truths they are discovering apply to God's creation and how to think clearly about what they are learning, allowing them to argue for their positions on a plethora of topics. Students learn that disagreement need not be disagreeable and that their opinions must be seasoned with respect rather than rebellion.

Rhetoric

**The third stage:
High school years**

During the final stage of the Trivium, students focus on learning the science of communication and the art of expression. Students focus on mastering language as they learn to present their thoughts in an articulate, well-reasoned, and convincing fashion. Students express their knowledge of subjects through both written compositions and oral presentations.

This stage is especially helpful for students studying the SAT and/or ACT.

Parent Orientation 2011-2012

Mission Statement:

Veritas Classical Schools assist homeschooling parents by partnering with them to communicate the truth, train the mind and cultivate the heart in a Christ-honoring atmosphere.

1. **Veritas Email Addresses:** Please be sure you put these in your contact list so your email provider will recognize them. This year our website will be our method of communicating weekly news, however, you may receive email periodically from

2. **Declaration of Intent and Attendance Forms:** You must file Declaration and monthly Attendance forms with **your** County School Board. Also make a copy of the form for VCS, and a copy of each monthly attendance record. These forms are on the website and should be emailed to the school.
3. **Curriculum/supplies:** Your child's curricula and supplies need to be brought to school every week. Please put his/her name in each book, and label his/her lunch box, outerwear and sweaters.
4. **Assignment Sheets** - Students will receive a detailed Assignment Sheet each week from your teacher VIA the student's **Engrade** account (lower grades receive a Pacer). Your teacher will let you know specifically where this weekly assignment will be located, and how to access it. Please print each Assignment sheet before school each week, and have your child bring his/her assignment sheet /pacer to school for the teacher to explain the next week's assignments. Parents are responsible to guide, teach, and review their child's work and sign the form to indicate completion of all assignments. If a child falls behind in his/her work, the teacher and parent must meet and develop an action plan.
5. **Parents, you will be very involved with your child in completion of all assignments given.** If your child is not prepared, it will be very difficult to take part in classes. Because you are homeschooling, your involvement in your child's education is essential. *We strongly urge you to keep your own weekly log of your child's grades, so you can know how your child is doing.* (Fall workshop date: MCD 9/12, PTC 9/6, COL 9/7).
6. **Dress Code** - The goals of our Veritas Dress Code are **cleanliness and modesty**. Since class time involves only one day each week, we ask that the Dress Code not become an issue. Please adhere to the published requirements: any solid color CLASSIC POLO SHIRT, (long or short sleeve), solid color pants, or Capri's. Shorts are acceptable and should extend to just above the knee. Skirts and jumpers for girls should also extend to just above the knee. Shoe color and style is left to parents.

If your child is not dressed appropriately, you may be called to bring proper clothes.

We have a "relaxed dress" VCS Spirit Day one day per month, usually the last day of the month on "Pizza Lunch" day. Students may wear appropriately length jeans and appropriate T-shirts. 10. **Tuition Payments** - Tuition is **DUE ON the 1st of the month**, and is late after the 5th of each month. Checks for tuition should be made payable to "Veritas Classical Schools." Tuition checks should be mailed directly to:

Please do not send tuition payments with your child to give to the teacher. **All checks should be mailed.** A \$20.00 late fee will be assessed if tuition is not received **by the 5th of the month.** *We depend on your tuition to pay your teacher/s.*

11. **Scheduled Absences** – For a planned absence, parents, PLEASE ask for and complete an "Assignments Request Form" and notify your teacher/s **at least two weeks in advance.** This is absolutely necessary so your teacher/s can make arrangements for your child's work.

12. **Multiple Absences** – Please make sure that your child attends class every week. Multiple absences make it very difficult for students to do excellent work and keep up. Please make every effort to **plan family events, holidays, Doctor's visits and special occasions around school days.**

13. **Lunch and Snacks** - Students in grades 1 – 12th should bring lunch, a snack, and a drink. They may also bring a plastic water bottle to drink during class. No eating or snacking will be allowed during class time. If your child forgets his or her lunch, and you cannot get their lunch to them, peanut butter crackers, cheese crackers, and bottled water may be purchased from Veritas. Teachers will not get lunch for students.

Pizza lunch will be provided once a month at a cost of \$5.00.

We would like for you to pay for the entire year if at all possible. Pizza Forms on web site.

14. **Communication** - When emailing us, please include your first and last name, campus, and phone. Veritas administration and teachers will communicate with you, mainly through the engrade account. Please check the web site for news weekly and your child's engrade account **regularly.** Upper grade teachers: Please make sure you communicate with the parent of any child who emails or phones you directly. Send copies of student requests, by

email, to parents to keep them informed of their child's questions, comments and/or concerns. FACEBOOK concerns, Veritas policy.

15. **Inclement Weather** - Veritas schools follow public school closings for each county. The McDonough campus will follow Henry County and Peachtree City campus will follow Fayette County, Columbus County follows Muscogee County.
16. **Prayer Chains** - Each **class list** serves as a phone chain and will be activated for prayer requests and other important announcements. Class Directories will be emailed to you when school begins. Your privacy is important to us. We protect email addresses by blind copying. If you do not want your phone number, address, or email included, please let your teacher know asap after the meeting. We will forward to you important prayer concerns that we receive from the main Veritas office. If you have an important prayer concern, call or email your chaplain, Dan Camp, immediately at eEncourager@aol.com. He will pray and activate all campuses for prayer on your behalf.
17. **ITBS Testing** – Veritas will administer ITBS Standardized Testing for students in the Spring of every year. This is a yearly accreditation standard. 1st-10th grade students must take the tests. 11th and 12th grade students who are taking the PSAT, SAT, or ACT may exempt Veritas ITBS testing and yearly scores must be given to Veritas. A *small testing fee for machine grading is required.*
18. **Cell phones: All student cell phones should be turned off during class.** If a problem occurs and continues, teachers will need to take up all phones before school each week. Students may check voice mail or messaging during breaks only. **Students may NOT bring iPods, Game Boys or any other electronic devices or toys to school.** Students can bring Frisbees and game balls for recess.
19. **Weapons: Zero Tolerance!!** Includes Scout knives or fake items that might scare other students. Send student immediately to office. Parent will be called to come get child.
20. **Verbal Bullying: Zero Tolerance!!** Send child immediately to Mrs. Camp (see: Code of Conduct).
21. **High School Credits:** This year 9th – 12th graders participating in all the Humanities classes will receive 4 ½ credits for the year. Rhetoric I (Critical Thinking/Logic) is included in these credits. A Veritas Transcribing Request Form must be completed for high school students requiring a transcript. Please contact Mrs. Shiflett for questions. Please refer to "Home Study Course Form" for courses taken outside of Veritas for high school transcribing.
22. **Report Cards** – Twice a year Veritas sends out Report Cards. **The first one will be attached to the Engrade account in January after 1st semester. Final report cards are attached to the Engrade account after June 1.** Mid-semester (First Semester) parent-teacher conferences will be set up by your child's teacher and will be held before school, during lunch, and after school. All other parent/teacher conferences will be by request only throughout the school year. Mid-semester (second semester), teachers will notify parents if students' average falls below 80 %.
23. **Parent / Student Handbook:** Please read and refer to this handbook throughout the school year. After reading it initially, discuss it as a family. Each parent and student must sign the form in the back of the handbook and bring it to your child's teacher.
24. **Websites:** The official website for our campuses is www.veritasatlantsw.org. Improvements and additions to the website are made regularly. We will email you about things you need to know on the website as soon as they are completed. The master Veritas website is www.veritasschools.com.
25. Medical Consent forms, Code of Conduct forms, High School Lunch Permission forms, and Parent/Student Handbook forms **must be signed and returned to your teacher/s asap**. Teachers keep these forms with them at school at all times.
